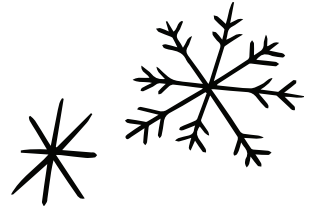


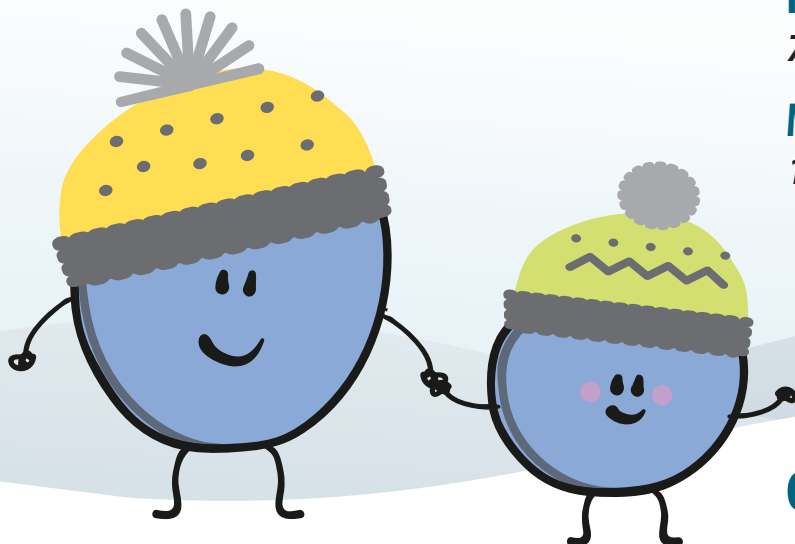
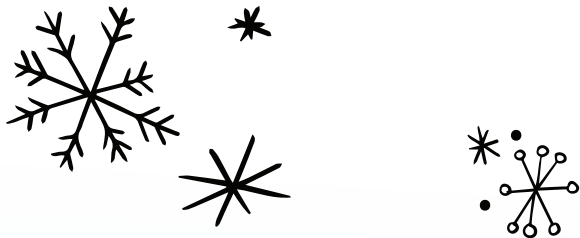
2019 MIDWINTER RECESS FREE LUNCH
